## Science Institutes Offered This Summer

Mercer University will offer summer institutes for teachers of chemistry and mathematics, according to an announcement by Dr. Rufus C. Harris, president.

This is the first year such institutes are being offered at Mercer. They are being offered under the sponsorship of the National Science Foundation.

Dr. Franklin W. James, professor and chairman of the department of chemistry, will direct the institute in chemistry for secondary school teachers and science supervisors. About 30 teachers are expected to participate in the eight-week program.

Dr. James said the major objective of the institute is to strengthen the subject-matter competence of teachers as set forth in materials prepared by the Chemical Education Material Study (CHEM Study) program. He said the deadline for applications is Feb. 15.

Dr. William F. Palmer, assistant professor of mathematics at Mercer, will direct the institute in mathematics for elementary school leadership personnel beginning June 14. About 40 teachers are expected to participate in the six-week program offering two courses. Each participant may receive 10 hours of graduate credit.

## McBride Going To Germany

Charles Wilbur McBride, sophomore from Statesboro, Georgia, was notified this week that he had been chosen with about 10 other students from all over the United States to spend his junior year in Germany. McBride, a ministerial student, will leave on Sept. 1, 1965, to go to Hiedelburg, Germany, to study at the famous University of Hiedelburg. Mr. Wilbur Jobe, professor in German here, was mainly responsible for getting McBride into the Hiedelburg Program which originates out of Eiken, Ohio.

While at Mercer, McBride has been a member of the BSU, CSU, German Club of which he is vice president, Phi Eta Sigma, and has constantly been named to the Dean's List. McBride is the son of Mr. and Mrs. C. Wilbur McBride, Statesboro, Georgia.
