

Sports Scope

The Mercer Bears baseball team scored 4 big runs in the fourth inning to overcome a 3-run deficit Monday and went on to defeat the Oglethorpe University Petrels 4-3.

The Petrels scored the first run in the second inning on two walks, a single, and a fielder's choice. In the third they came back for two more, as Mercer pitcher Ronnie Davis allowed one walk, the Petrels hit three fielder's choices and the Bears committed two errors. After the third inning Davis held the Oglethorpe team scoreless, to increase his personal record to 4 wins and only one loss.

The Bears' four runs in the fourth came as they made five big hits. Maddox led off with a ground rule double and Goodman brought him in with a single to center. Alton Kendall singled Goodman to third, and Davis brought in the second run with an infield hit. Richard Jordan grounded to short to score Kendall, while Davis advanced to second. Sandy Harris then came up

with a ground rule double for the fourth and deciding run.

Davis walked four and struck out eight while allowing only two hits. Coach Smith described Davis' fast ball as "just right," and said "He used it just in the right spots." The Bears now stand 11-3 with 7 games remaining, guaranteeing them a winning season.

The Georgia Southern Eagles soared over the Mercer Bears Wednesday afternoon in Bear field, racking up 8 big runs on 13 hits, while Mercer got 5 runs on 8 hits.

Sandy Harris went six and one-third innings for the Bears and

was charged with the loss after giving up five runs on 9 hits. DeWall Waters came in for one frame, giving up 3 runs on three hits, while fanning one and walking two. Charles Stewart came in then, and held the Eagles to only one more hit for the remainder of the game, giving up no runs, striking out one and walking one.

The first two innings went scoreless but Southern scored first in the third on a single and a double. The Eagles grabbed another run in the fourth, but in the bottom half of the fourth Mercer came back with 2 big ones to tie the game.

In the fifth the Eagles scored two more on a Mercer error to make the score 4-2 and in the top of the seventh stretched their lead to 5-2.

Mercer scored two more in the bottom of the seventh. One man walked, Harris singled, both advanced on an infield out and both scored on an error.

But Southern came through with four hits, one walk, and two Mercer errors in the eighth, to score three more runs and cinch the game. The Bears managed one more run in the ninth, making it 8-5, but couldn't keep the rally going.
