## MEET THE BEARS

### A Look at Bob Reeves

This week's sports spotlight falls on Bob Reeves, a three letter Bear guard. Bob was chosen to start the series because of his outstanding performance last year and promise for this season.

Bob is a senior from Americus, Georgia, where he also played ball and was the team's leading scorer. Coming to Mercer as a freshman in 1961, Bob picked up his first letter in basketball playing for the Bears in 23 games during the 61-62 season. That year, as a novice to college ball, he only scored 64 points for an average of 2.78 per game, and got 63 rebounds; but when the next season rolled around, Bob's form came through and in 19 games he compiled 248 points for a 13.3 average. At one point in the season, he had a 19 point average; but he was injured and his average and his performance were hindered.

During the 63-64 season, Bob was sidelined with a broken bone in his wrist but came through last season with 466 points in 24 games for a 19.4 average and 135 rebounds. He was also chosen "Most Outstanding Player." Each consecutive season

Bob does not have the components of a big, modern ball player, being only six ft. tall and weighing in at about 165, but as Coach Wilder puts it, "Bob isn't big, but has a great instinctiveness for the game." When asked to comment on Bob, Coach Wilder had these praising statements, "Bob is one of the best competitors that Mercer has had in many years, and he's the type player a coach likes to see come out for the team. Bob should prove to be a very important asset in a winning team this year."

Bob is a 21 year old Economics major and a law minor. After finishing here at Mercer, he expressed hopes of furthering his education along the lines of law. Bob also has views about this year's season. He feels confident that the team will surpass last year's won-loss record, and that the team's winning will be due to speed and accuracy.

## MICAs Win Tennis Title

The women's tennis tournament came to a close Tuesday, with the women of MICA coming out as the Campus Womens Champs. The action on the final day had MICA facing the netters of Chi Omega; both teams had previously posted three wins against no losses.
