PHI DELTA THETA:

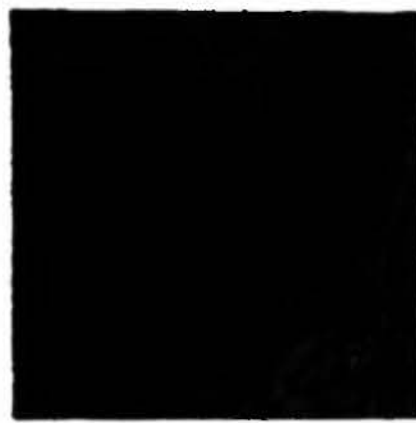
New furniture has been recently donated to the Phi Delt lodge.
