The "Black Berets" of Mercer's Army ROTC department, the "Mercer Marauders" counter-guerrilla unit, have been a center of activity throughout the year.

Training and exercising two days each week, the Marauders have provided demonstrations of combat methods and techniques on several occasions during the year and have gone into the field on maneuvers, assisting the ROTC department's program preparing Cadet Juniors for Summer Camp at Ft. Bragg, N. C.

Within the past few weeks, the Marauders comprised the force opposing the third year ROTC students in tactical operations and other training projects. On the weekend of May 6, a force of Marauders and Cadet Seniors "fought" the juniors on a government reservation outside of Macon.
