## Appointments Approved

The board approved President Harris' recommendation that Dr. Jean Hendricks, chairman of the Department of Psychology, be named Kilpatrick Professor of Psychology. The chair is a gift of friends of the late Dr. William Heard Kilpatrick, former Mercer professor and internationally-known educator.

D. Meade Feild, dean of the Walter F. George School of Law, was named to fill the Macon Chair of Law which was made possible years ago by the gift of Macon friends of the law school.

The trustees approved naming the ROTC drill field in honor of Lt. Thomas Gary Sikes of Jacksonville, the first and only Mercer ROTC graduate to be killed in Vietnam combat.

A request of the Student Government Association that the balcony lounge in the Connell Student Center be named the David Bingham Duncan Memorial Lounge was approved. Duncan, who was from Atlanta, was killed in an automobile accident last year while he was a junior at Mercer.

## New Trustees

The new trustees, elected by the Georgia Baptist Convention last month, were installed at the Mercer Trustees Meeting. They were Lamar R. Plunkett of Bowden, Charles A. Jay of Macon, Charles C. Giddens of Adel, T. Hiram Stanley and Dr. Abraham B. Conger, both of Columbus, Charles W. Walker of Macon and Dr. J. Estill Jones of Thomson.

F. Baldwin Martin of Macon was reelected chairman of the Executive Committee and will continue in his position as chairman of the Board of Trustees for another term.

## Dr. Harris Elected to SACS

Dr. Rufus Carrollton Harris, president of Mercer University, has been elected to the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

The commission is a policy making body of the College Delegate Assembly of the association. The assembly is the final authority for accreditation of colleges and universities within the 11-state and Latin American region served by the association.

The membership of the commission, according to the association, is made up of educators who "reflect the thinking of the best minds in the South on the critical problems of higher education."

President Harris has been associated with American higher education for many years. He was president of Tulane University for 23 years and has been president of Mercer since 1960.

# Holsenbeck Receives Marksmanship Award

Colonel Joseph H. Jones, Professor of Military Science of Mercer University, has awarded to Cadet Lieutenant Colonel Linton S. Holsenbeck of Milledgeville the Marksmanship Certificate from the National Rifle Matches held at Camp Perry, Ohio.

Holsenbeck was selected as one of ten team members from Army ROTC Cadet Corps of the Third U.S. Army. During the nine days of competition with more

than 795 individuals at Camp Perry, Holsenbeck fired third place in the Third Army Team.

The National Matches involved competition in pistol, smallbore rifle, and high-powered rifle among civilian, as well as all service teams. Sponsors of the matches are the National Rifle Association (NRA) and the National Board for Promotion of Rifle Practice.

Holsenbeck, a pre-med senior in the Mercer College of Liberal Arts, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. L.S. Holsenbeck, Jr., Route 2, Lake Shore Drive, Milledgeville, Georgia. He has lettered the last two years on the varsity rifle team, earning the "High Average" trophy last year, and was recently selected by Colonel Jones to command the First Battalion, Mercer Cadet Corps.
