Mercer's Delegation

Mercer had a large delegation present at the convention which met in Augusta on Wednesday and Thursday of this week. Among the college officials who attended the meeting were: Dr. A. P. Montague, Dr. J. G. Harrison, Dr. J. W. Jent, Dr. B. D. Ragsdale, Mr. S. W. Garrett, Mr. J. Fred Eden, and Mr. Gainer Bryan.

Dr. A. P. Montague addressed the convention with a challenge to Georgia Baptists to come to the support of Christian education in the state. Dr. Montague also made a report to the trustees of the institution relative to the present status of the institution which was very favorably received by the board. Dr. J. G. Harrison read the report of the committee on Public Welfare, while Dr. B. D. Ragsdale served as Secretary of the convention. He was re-elected for the thirty-third time.

Students Present

The students who attended the convention were: Leslie Williams, Robert Whipple, H. M. Cannon, and G. L. Bond.

Most of the time Wednesday morning was devoted to the discussion of affairs at Mercer. A report on the condition of the college made by Dr. W. L. Pickard, a former president, showed the institution to be in good condition while another special report by Dr. H. M. Willet, of Atlanta, recommended the raising of an endowment fund for the university.

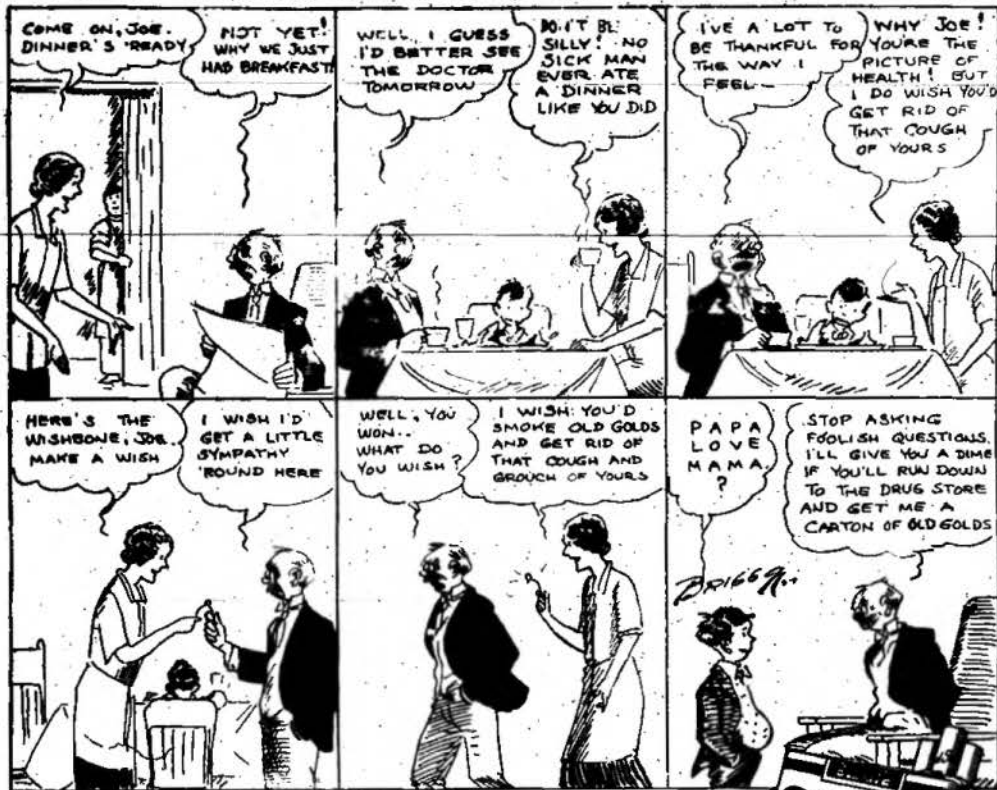
