

ENTRANCE UNITS ARE RAISED HERE

Mercer Law School to Require More Hours Credit for Entrance

Requirements for the entrance of students to the Mercer University law school have been stepped through changes in rules governing eligibility which were made at the annual convention of the American Association of Law Schools, which was held at Chicago, Dec. 29, 30, and 31. It was announced by Professor Joe A. McClain, dean of the school at Mercer.

Adds Four Hours

According to the new ruling, before a student is eligible for entrance to a law school which is a member of the American Association, he must have at least half as many term hours as the school requires for a bachelor's degree. This will raise the requirement at Mercer to 90 hours whereas the former requirement was only 86 term hours.

This change in eligibility governs only those schools that are members of the American Association. The former requirement in these schools of entrance was that the student have prior credit.

Wants College Training

A speech delivered by Silas H. Strawn, president of the American Bar Association, advocating college preparation for admittance to the bar is the most impressive happening at the convention, according to Professor McClain. He says that Mr. Strawn stated that although he was not a college graduate himself, he thinks that the changed conditions it is foolish to continue to admit members to the bar who have not received college training.

William R. Vance also spoke on the same occasion which was a dinner given.
