

DR. BURTS WILL SPEAK TUESDAY

Baptist Pastor to Make Address as Part of Founder's Day Exercises

The exercises held in observance of Founder's Day, Jan. 14, have been deferred from Saturday, Jan. 14, until Tuesday, Jan. 17, according to an announcement made by Dr. A. P. Montague. The reason attributed for the change was the fact that Founder's Day falls on Saturday, a day on which no chapel exercises are held.

Dr. C. E. Burt, pastor of the First Baptist church of this city and one of the most prominent Baptist preachers of the South, will deliver the Founder's Day address at the regular chapel hour Tuesday morning. Other particulars in regard to the program for the day have not been formulated.

In the past it has been the custom for the university to enjoy a holiday or that portion after chapel. Dr. Montague intimated that this custom would be adhered to, but just how great a portion of the day would be observed depended upon the decision of the university faculty, which is to meet at an early date to decide the question.
