calion and psychology.

A master's degree also will be given in which no thesis will be required, the student substituting certain courses, probably in science and education instead. This is the first time Mercer has offered a master's degree without the candidate presenting a thesis to the examiners.

**Journalism Dropped**  
The journalism requirement for graduation with the A. B. degree has been discontinued, the faculty holding that it being a professional course, was not necessary to men receiving other degrees. It has been required that all students complete the first course in journalism for graduation. Journalism will be a department and not a school under the new plans. The other requirements for graduation, such as public speaking, will remain.

Another new plan that will be inaugurated at Mercer next year is the general English test to be given to all members of the Junior-class during the first quarter of their junior year. This test is to be repeated each quarter for the benefit of those students who might fail to pass it the first time. This test will consist of practice in spelling, grammar, composition and each student must complete the test before he can receive any degree at Mercer.
