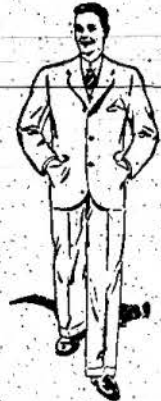

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**ELLER IS ELECTED HEAD OF Y. M. C. A.**

Eugene Eller, of North Wilkesboro, N. C., was elected president of the Mercer Y. M. C. A. for the year 1928-29 at a meeting of that organization Tuesday night. Eller's name was the only one placed before the body by the nominating committee. Other officers elected were: Alton Williams, Collins, Ga., vice-president; Cecil Franklin, Tenuille, Ga., secretary; and Waymon Reese, Madison, Ga., treasurer.

The new officers will assume their duties next year. Together with Bernum Hawkes, of Macon, present president, they will leave Friday to attend the annual conference of College Y. M. and Y. W. C. A.'s of Georgia at Camp Wilkins, near Athens. While there, they will be trained for their offices. Approximately 125 delegates are expected to attend the conference which will last through Sunday.

Eller, the new president of the "Y," has been active in student affairs. He has held office in the Phi Delta Literary Society, is retiring president of the Ministerial Association, and is head of the circulation department of The Cluster. He is pastor of a church near Cuthbert.
