

WOMEN TO LEARN BASKETBALL ART

Coach Jenkins Will Instruct Fairer Sex in Fundamentals of Basketball

Further proof that woman is coming into her own in the athletic world is given by the announcement of J. H. Jenkins, coach of the famous Vynna "Wonder Five," that he will teach basketball for girls at Mercer this summer. Summer school starts June 12 and lasts through August 21.

Last summer a number of women stated their desire for a course in basketball coaching. Mr. Jenkins was teaching such a course for men. Because of the demand, Mr. Jenkins will offer instruction this summer for both men and women.

The course for women is called "Basketball for Girls." Instruction is to be given in passing, catching, jumping, shooting, bouncing, foul-shooting,

practice forms, tip-off plays, floor plays, out-of-bound plays and training rules.

In the past three years, the Vienna team Mr. Jenkins has been coaching has won nine championships: Middle Georgia, 1926, '27 and '28; Cotton States, 1927, '28; Peach Belt, 1926, '27; State, 1927, '28. In the national tournament last year, Vienna was defeated in the quarter-finals by the team that won the national championship.
