hands of Dr. Montague, who was then president of that institution, it was disclosed by the pair at the banquet.

Tom Cobb was the first student called upon by Gilbert, who stated he was going to demonstrate that the club included many orators. Cobb, who is editor of The Cauldron, paid tribute to Dr. Montague as a friend, educator, leader and executive.

Charlton "Little Bit" Pierce, president of the Senior class, urged that the students be given a clearer understanding of the affairs of the university, citing the University of Florida, where, he said, all plans and actions of the administration were explained to students.

**Simple Tribute Paid**

"We love you," was the simple tribute, which Barnum Hawkes, president of the Y. M. C. A., paid to Dr. Montague in a short address. E. W. Dupree, president of the Ministerial Association, who followed Hawkes, expressed a desire for a better understanding between the various groups of the student body. He urged that each member of the club carry back to his group the ideals of the Presidents' Club. He invited all students to the ministerial association meetings, stating that Dr. Montague would speak at one of them soon.

Aubrey Estes, president of the Phi Delta literary society, thought the faculty here were "bears," he said, before entering school, but he now plans to return next year because of what the institution has to offer.

Charles Cork, president of the Senior law class, quoted the advice of a text on public speaking which stated that a full meal should not be eaten before making an address and added that since he had eaten a full meal, he should not speak. He pledged the cooperation of the law students in university matters.

**Garrett is Praised**

At this point, Gilbert spoke on the subject of improvements made in the campus and praised Mr. Garrett for his services as business manager. The club members tendered Mr. Garrett a going vote of thanks in appreciation of his efforts.

Introduced as "the man who will be here three years from now," Archie Grimalds, president of the Freshman class, described his sudden entrance into Mercer and his pleasure now in contrast to the disappointment he felt last September when he could not enter the University of Virginia. Grimalds paid tribute to Dr. Montague, saying, "He almost persuaded me to take Latin." The freshman president expressed the wish that his class might accomplish something in behalf of the institution. In dismissing the banquet, the toastmaster mentioned a plan whereby towns will be visited by student speakers in order to increase interest of citizens in Mercer.
