

SONGSTERS VISIT EATONTON TODAY

Mercer Singers Leave Today on Long Tour of Northeast Georgia

The Mercer Glee club will not be seen in Athens Monday night, as was first announced, but will give a performance in Augusta on the same night which it was to have played in Athens. The singers will leave the campus today for Eatonton where they will show tonight. Tomorrow night they will go to Warrenton, Ga.

The glee men will arrive in Augusta Sunday for the appearance there Monday night and bands of the Mercer men will sing at different churches in the city Sunday evening. The Mercerians will stay in Augusta longer than any other city on the itinerary, as they will not leave for Elberton till Tuesday morning. From Elberton the club will go to Monroe, Hartwell, Newnan and West Point.

Chorus Men Drilled
Dr. B. P. Richardson, director of the Glee club, has been giving practices for the chorus during the week so as to prepare the singers for the appearances which will be made at the Georgia towns. Announcement was made that Pete Warlick, first tenor, and Bailey Davis, second tenor, would probably not accompany the club on the ten-day tour.

Dick Cotton, Macon vaudeville star who expects to enter Mercer next

year, will occupy the place left vacant when Riley McKay, veteran black-face entertainer, graduated last term. Hardman Jones, the other tenor in the cast, will support Mr. Cotton in his blackface role.

Leaving Columbus Sunday morning, the singers will arrive in Macon Sunday afternoon or night. This is the last long tour of the Glee club for the school year, and according to all reports, this season has been one of the most successful ones in the past several years. Logan Bloodworth is manager of the organization.

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
