

LAW CLUB AIMS NAMED BY JENT

Three Purposes Cited by Speaker At First Meeting of Legal Body.

Pollard Jent spoke on the Purpose of the Law Club at the first meeting of the Mercer university law school which was held in the law library Monday.

His address was delivered primarily to the freshman class, but was of interest to all members. Mr. Jent in his speech outlined three aims of the Law club, first, the development of a professional spirit; second, congeniality among the law students; and third, to obtain speakers for a series of lectures to be rendered to the Law club in the near future.

A committee was appointed consisting of the following: Fred New, Oneida, Tenn., chairman; J. Q. Davidson; Fort Valley, and O. C. Custer, Bainbridge. It is the work of this committee to secure the speakers for lectures. The name of Mr. Robert Hitch, an eminent attorney of Savannah and alumnus of Mercer, was mentioned to the committee as a capable speaker and one who would fit in with the program mapped out by the committee. It is understood that Mr. Hitch has only recently finished a series of lectures on Roman law and it is hoped that the committee may be able to obtain him.
