The glee club will leave Macon for New York June 5th. This trip will be made in the new airship Macon. This mode of travel was secured through Congressman Carl Vinson. Before leaving New York, the club will make a week appearance at the Roxy theater.

The first country to be visited will be either England or London, where the club will be entertained by King George. The tour will be concluded in September in time for the members of the club to return to school.

If this trip proves to be a success, it is highly probable that a trip will be made to Cuba during the Christmas holidays. A trip to Cuba has been planned for the past twenty-five years, but has never been successful because a large enough majority of the members of the club have wanted to make the trip.

The soul purpose of this trip, it was announced, is to advertise Mercer, and is being made with the understanding that glee clubs of universities in the countries to be visited will visit Macon, and Mercer next year. The Oxford glee club has already stated that it will come to Macon next spring and be here for the commencement dances.

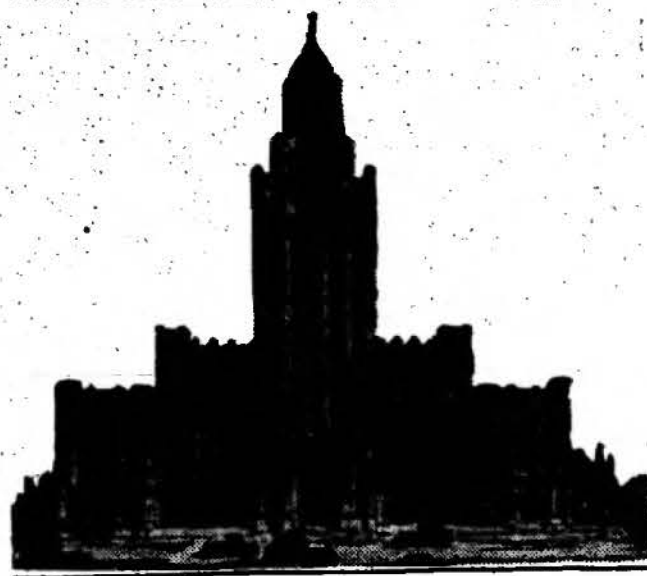
How Sir Thomas Malory Covereth A Football Joust For The Hyscholia

BOARD OF TRUSTEES ANNOUNCE NEW PLANS

28 Story Building To Be Erected On Campus To Supplant Existing Buildings

The construction of a \$5,000,000 building to house Mercer University, has just been announced by the Board of Trustees. The source of the money was unannounced, but it is understood that someone who wishes his identity kept a secret had given the money for the huge edifice.

Plans call for a 28 story building which will house the entire university. There will be a huge gymnasium, a swimming pool, various recreational devices, heating system, cooling and humidifying system all in the basement floors.

The main ground floor will include the offices of the administration, an auditorium seating 7,000, a smaller auditorium seating 1,500 completely equipped for motion pictures, etc., dining halls, and 20 class rooms. The next three floors will be devoted to classrooms and laboratories.

In the remainder of the building there will be rooms and apartments for students. This space will take up 3,000 rooms which will accommodate 5,500 students. The first seven floors will be de-
