Professor Robinson departed from his humorous discourse for a moment to say, "A school like Berry does more for you than you will ever dream. Why not do something for Berry. teen yards put them on the 40. Allen kicked out of bounds on the Moccasin 13. An exchange of punts gave the Bears the ball on the Moccasin 48. Smith made 4 yards through guard but Varner failed to gain, and Allen punted out of bounds on the Chattanooga 15. Klein punted right back and Allen was downed on the nooga 38 yard marker.

Second Half.
Following an exchange of punts at the start of the third quarter Watland took Bloodworth's kick and returned 39 yards to Mercer's 25. His pass to Perry over the goal line was batted down by Lee.

After the kickoff, two passes by Bloodworth were intercepted, and

finally, Chattanooga kicked to the Mercer 42 yard stripe. A pass, Bloodworth to Warlick, put the ball on the Moccasin 20. Billy Smith made 7 through the line, and Bloodworth made it first down on the Moccasin 5. Smith carried it to the 1 yard line, but on the next two plays, the Chattanoogaans, expecting the line plunge, held; then Bloodworth ran through a gaping hole in the weak side of the opposing line and scored standing up. Bloodworth's kick for the winning extra point, failed. A few seconds later, the game ended with the ball in midfield. Score: Mercer, 13; Chattanooga, 13.
