## Library Notes

The University Library is open from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and again from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. On Saturday the hours are 8:30 a.m. to 12 noon.

Most of the books in the library, except bound and unbound periodicals and the books in the reference room, may be taken out for home use for either one of two weeks. Certain of the courses assigned for parallel reading circulate for three days only. Other types of books on parallel reading circulate overnight, i.e., they may be checked out anytime after eight o'clock on week nights or anytime between eleven and twelve o'clock on Saturdays. These books on overnight charges must be returned to the library at 8:30 a.m. the following morning, or in the case of Saturday charges, on the following Monday morning.

Books returned after the day they are due are subject to a fine of two

cents a day. Books returned late on hour they are overdue and ten cents overnight charges are subject to a additional hour for each hour therefine of twenty-five cents the first after.
