Mercer Beats Georgia

In Centennial Stadium last Saturday afternoon local fans saw a Mercer athletic team victorious over the University of Georgia for the first time in three years. Not since the fall of 1933, when the present senior members of the grid squad were freshmen and defeated the Bulldogs 12-0, have the Bears been able to come out ahead of the Bulldogs from Athens in any athletic competition. This time it was the Mercer cross-country team, under the capable direction of Coach Henry Rogers, which turned the tables on the visiting Athenians by administering a decisive 25-33 defeat over a difficult three and a half mile course during the intermission between halves of the Cub-G. M. C. football game. Hats off to the Harriers! They have achieved something that only freshman football teams have been able to do in the past with any degree of consistency. In varsity football Mercer has never been victorious, and the basketball and baseball teams have met with little more success. May this be a sign of the changing of the tide!

Too Much Furman

The 1936 Mercer Homecoming in most respects was one of the best in the history of the institution. The parade was by far the longest in recent years, and the fine spirit shown by the student body was all that any team could desire. The fine attendance at the game was evidence that Macon is about ready to support a good team. Only one thing marred an otherwise perfect weekend. This was the presence of an all powerful Purple Hurricane eleven from Greenville that swept back the Bears by a 20-9 score. The Mercerians put up a game fight, but for the first time this season the linemen found themselves outcharged by a heavier forward wall and the backs had to cope with the most versatile passing attack we've seen this year. In defeat the Bears put up a close and exciting battle throughout, the high point of the game being Bloodworth's brilliant touchdown run after intercepting a Furman pass. This 96-yard gallop will probably go down in the record books as the longest run of the current season.

Much credit should go to Coach McCleod and his Furman boys. They have a clean hard-fighting team that should easily hold its own with the other members of the Southern conference of which it has recently been made a member.

Cub Razzle Dazzle

Coach NeSmith's strong freshman crew surprised even its most ardent supporters with a convincing 25-0 triumph over the G. M. C. Cadets here Saturday afternoon. In addition to their expected powerful offense, they flashed an alert offensive drive that could not be stopped short of four touchdowns. Lateral passes played no small part in the victory of the yearlings over their opponents, and probably the most exciting play of the game was one in which the ball was handled by four different players before it crossed the goal line. Accurate forward passing also featured the Cubs' attack. Some of these boys should prove valuable additions to next year's varsity. Coach Russell granted his varsity players two days of rest Monday and Tuesday but they began work again in earnest Wednesday afternoon in preparation for their game with the Chattanooga Moccasins in Chattanooga next week-end. They have an open date this week.

Mercer Cub Team Wins Over G. M. C.

Freshmen Take Second Game Of Season, Defeating Gordon 25-0

The Mercer Cubs in their second game of the season outplayed the Gordon Cadets, winning 25-0. The G. M. C. attack wilted under the hard tackling of the Freshmen line, which altogether outcharged its opponent. Gordon backfield men at the end of the game wound up with a total loss of one yard from scrimmage. The Cubs, although suffering from fifteen penalties, amounting to 125 yards, had a total gain of 159 yards from a running attack.

One of the outstanding plays by the Mercer freshmen was a triple lateral which they completed with the finesse and accuracy of a more experienced crew. Malone drove through the line; and, seeing himself bottled up, tossed the ball to Harrison, who was tackled after

another gain of five yards. Before falling however, Harrison lateraled to Cline, who raced to the fifteen yard line before being hemmed in by three men. When about to be tackled, he threw the ball to Gillon, who stepped over the line unmolested.

The Cub team, which seems to include more varsity material than any Cub team in recent years, has three more games scheduled. They are: Abraham-Baldwin, Brewton-Parker, and the Oglethorpe "B" team.
