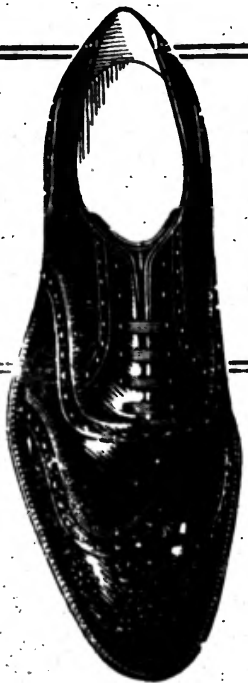

husky guard understudy to Martin Kumse, was back in the rough work for the first time in three weeks. The "Gorgeous Greek," as his team mates are wont to call him, turned in some nice blocking in the

line despite a stubborn shoulder injury, but he still shows a reticence at blocking in the open field.

Both varsity fullbacks are still on the shelf with injuries, leaving the burden of the number three back position on the shoulders of little Wright Bazemore. Fullback Johnny Mattox is still bothered by an ankle injury. Rod Tuach, defensive star of the last two games, has a split lip which required 15 stitches and will likely keep him out of all contact work until game time. Both men, however, are expected to be ready for action in the game on Turkey Day.

The Bears are expected to hurl a large number of passes in order to get by the Chattanooga defense which features a sliding line. The sliding line, while being weak on reverses, is disconcerting to the offense on strong side plays in that it provides an extra man for block-

ers to move.

A hard, bruising battle is in prospect for the two teams when they meet. Chattanooga was beaten by the score of 19-18 by Birmingham-Southern, a team which conquered Mercer seven to nothing. However, the Bears far outgained Southern, and if the scoring punch they have shown in recent games does not desert them, they should have a good chance to defeat the Moccasins.

Big Al Gerhardt may be the key to Mercer's chance for victory. The Gargantuan ex-tackle, who was shifted to center in an emergency move, has shown improvement in snapping the ball and in backing up the line. If he should prove a capable replacement for Phil Chastain, who is playing with a badly wrenched shoulder, he might provide the necessary strength in the middle of the line.
