PAN-HELLENIC OF SORORITIES ELECTS CO-EDS

Pulliam Named Secretary-Treasurer Of Council For Next Year

Claire Rowland, Macon, was elected president of the Pan-Hellenic council of sororities yesterday afternoon.

Margaret Pulliam was named secretary-treasurer of the sorority group for next year.

At a meeting yesterday afternoon new representatives of the sororities were selected for the Pan-Hellenic council. Miss Rowland and Christine Booth, Macon, will represent the Sigma Phi sorority, while Miss Pulliam and Ann Nolan, Macon, will represent Alpha Delta Pi.

According to a new ruling by the council, each of the sororities will also be represented by one alumni. Helen Glenn, Macon, will be the alumni representative of the Alpha Delta Pi group next year. The Sigma Phis have not named an alumni yet.

Rushing rules for Mercer co-ed students next year will provide a two-weeks rush period followed by a two-weeks silence period, the council decided. A preferential system of bidding will be used.

Miss Rowland is a member of the Cardinal Key sorority, the Alembic Science club, and the Co-ed Athletic Association. Miss Pulliam is a member of the International Relations Club, Ciceronian Literary Society, Kaper Club, Athletic Association, and vice-president and rush chairman of the Alpha Delta Pi sorority.

Phi Delta Theta put on a last inning drive to nose out its opponent. The ALT's scored most of their runs in two innings.

In last Saturday's games, Kappa Sigma shut out the strong Pi Kappa Alpha aggregation in the only game of the day, 6 to 0. In the other scheduled games Pi Kappa Phi won from Alpha Tau Omega by forfeit, and the Ministerial Association forfeited their game to the Non-Frats. Frank Cimperman, Kappa Sigma pitcher, gave up only two scratch hits, coming in the second and sixth innings. Kappa Sig scored in the first inning when Tuach walked and Kumse hit a home run. Art Pledger got a circuit blow in the third inning with no one on base. They scored again in the fourth and sixth innings.
