A Dartmouth College student has begun publication of a weekly newspaper for skiing enthusiasts.

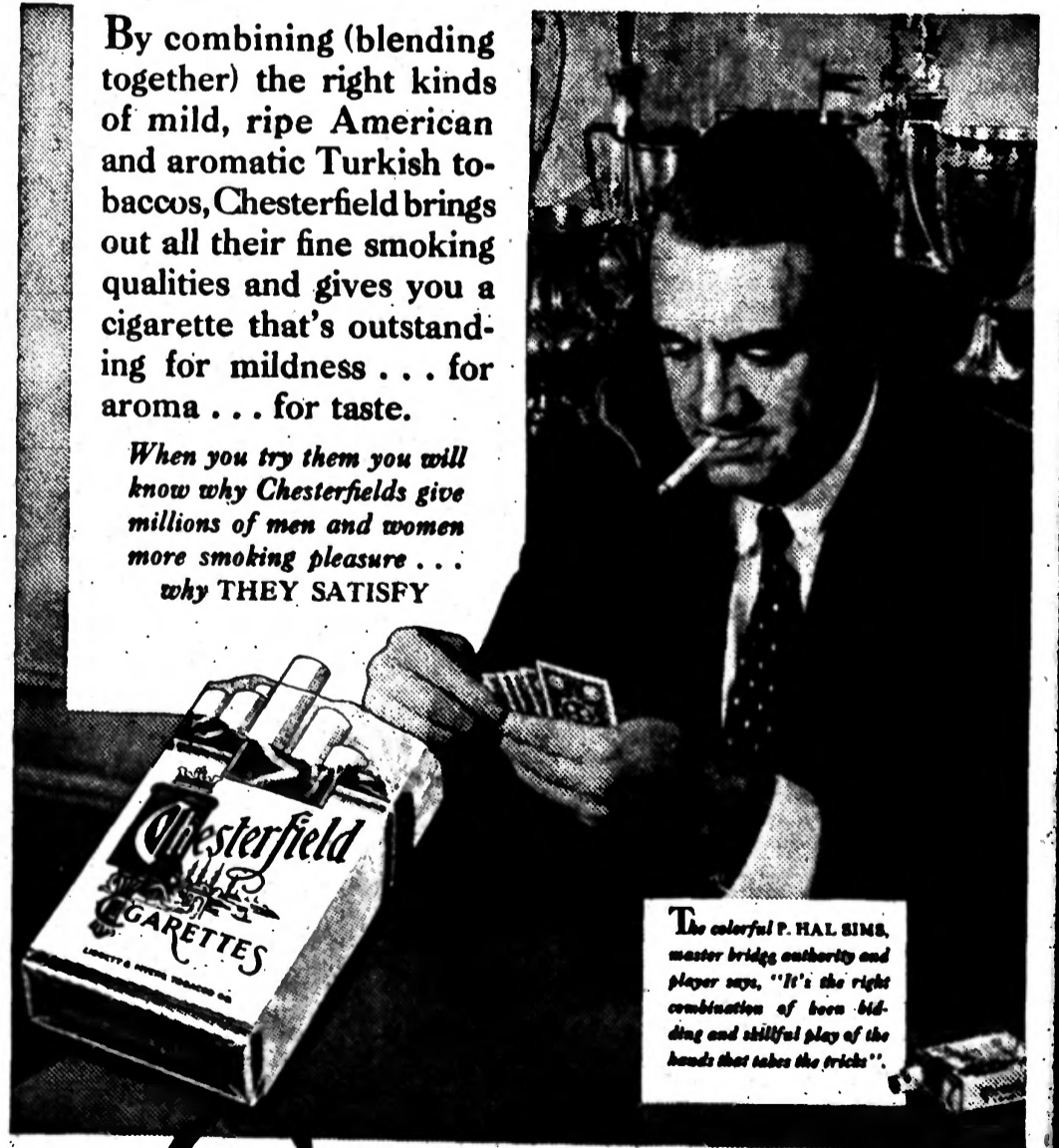
