HARVARD OFFERS 20 SCHOLARSHIPS

Graduate School To Sponsor Plan

Twenty national scholarships, with maximum awards of \$1,000 each, are offered this year by the Harvard Graduate School of Business Administration.

In an announcement this week, the Harvard Business School stated, "Applicants will be judged on basis of their college record, character and business experience, if any."

Recommendations from professors are required, and all applicants will be interviewed by a representative of the school. Amount of each scholarship will be adjusted to the applicant's individual financial need on basis of information he and his family can supply.

Successful applicants for these scholarships who secure satisfactory averages during the first year will be assured sufficient financial assistance to complete the two years on the M. B. A. degree.

Application forms may be secured from the Committee on Scholarship, Harvard University Graduate School of Business Administration, Morgan Hall, Soldiers Field, Boston, Mass.

All applications must be made not later than April 1.

COURIC PROMOTED IN NEW SET-UP

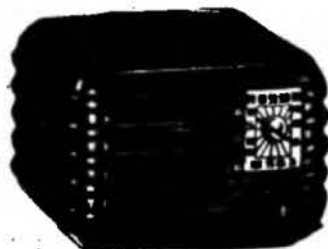
