America's leading exponent of "Swing Music," Jan Savitt, leads his Top-Hatters through two swell sets for top honors this week. One side leads the already nationally famous Tuxedo Junction done in the style. The arrangement is not the terrific one that Union Miller's happens to be nor is it the top-flight smash that the song's author Erskine Hawkins made one—but its plenty sold in its own right. What we really want to rave about, however, is Kansas City Moods. This jaunty, little jazz masterpiece is sure to mesh with those who like real jazz enough live music. There's a good full band opening, a nice touch with an M. Barlow trumpet ride, two swell piano and bass runs and a smashing full band finale. The theme is boogie-woogie in style and the whole little job has a mean jump. Don't miss this one.

Our old friend the Merry Men came along with Dressing Along With The Blues and Me. The former is very delightful a number while the latter moved along on the usual Merry Men plane.

The King of the Saxophone, James "Jimmy" Dorsey puts little Helen O'Connell in the vocal spotlight on a recording that clicks. Title is Keep A Knocking and its a catchy rhythmic number with easy lyrics. Nice jump music that you'll appreciate. Back side is titled Major and Minor Steps and is sure to see what the title implies. Watch for the "Little Man" hits in this one.

A new small combo headed by The Four Squires waxes a brace of real oldies in an interesting fashion. Especially worth your listening is Old Black Joe. There's a swell quiet trumpet and some good guitar work and new swinging style that makes this old ballad really rock. Baby Won't You Please Come Home tries hard but falls short of the other side.
