Trustee Makes Renovations

Money for the renovation of the Administration Building, now under way, was donated to Mercer by George McCommon, president of the Atlantic Cotton Mills, it has been announced by Dr. Spright Dowell, president of the University.

In addition to the work being done to the offices and class rooms in the building, reception rooms and parlors are being furnished on the first floor. The Administration Building has been standing since 1871, when the college was moved to Macon from Penfield, and the money received from Mr. McCommon is being used to restore its original beauty.

Mr. McCommon is a member of the board of trustees of Mercer and chairman of the committee of buildings and grounds.
