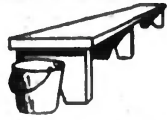


SIDELINE SURVEY

tion 13 per cent. U. S. Naval Drydocks, Terminal Island, Calif., won the Secretary's flag in August, and USMC Camp Lejeune, N. C. won the first "leg" of the flag.

The allotment program for uniformed personnel continued to show general increases. Navy allotments in effect on August 31 were 1,527,097; Marine Corps, 242,000, and Coast Guard, 85,433. Allotment sales for the month were \$9,782,793.75 by Navy; \$1,449,562.50 by the Marine Corps, and \$1,028,925 by the Coast Guard.
