Cardinal Key Sorority presented Frank Pursley, well-known blind piano instructor at the Georgia Academy for the Blind, in a concert of classical and semi-classical selections Thursday, May 1. The program opened at 8:15 in the Wilingham Chapel.

Pursley has given concerts all over the state and, for the past three and a half years, has been instructor in piano, organ, and theological work at the Georgia Academy for the Blind. He also directs the chorus there.

Pursley was educated at the University of Georgia, where he received his BFA degree with a major in music in 1943. He has also studied at Wesleyan Conservatory and at Agnes Scott College. After his graduation from the University he was awarded a scholarship by the American Foundation for the Blind for a year's study at the Juilliard School of Music in New York.

While his main interest is teaching music, Pursley says that he plays purely for love of playing. He feels that music is a good medium for anyone and will enlarge the chances of a blind person, increasing his opportunity to have worthwhile and numerous friends. In addition to playing, he also tunes and repairs pianos.

Included in Thursday night's performance, were Pastorale, by Scarlatti; Come Sweet Death and Bourree by Bach; and Beethoven's Sonata, Opus 31, No. two. Also played were two Brahms selections, Rhapsody in G Minor and Romance in F Major, Opus 18. Rondo Capriccioso by Mendelssohn and The Island Spell, by Ireland, were featured, as well as The Girl With the Flaxen Hair, Debussy, and Prelude in G Minor by Rachmaninoff.

Several novelty selections were played as encores.
