 tions, *The Cauldron*, *The Silhouette* and *The Cluster* are pledged to support this sort of government. For the first time in her history Mercer will have a co-ordinated student government."

In an open letter to the student body, stressing the need for greater participation in the student government, president Morgan said: "The officers of the Mercer student government have two major objectives for the coming year:

1. To revise the constitution so as to provide for student self-government.
2. To obtain student administration of student funds.

To accomplish either of these objectives will require the sustained interest and co-operation of a goodly majority of the members of the student body. There are, on our campus, students who are not interested in matters of student government. This is only to be expected in these unusual times. Many students today are several years older than the average pre-war college student. Some of them are married and have families. Most of them are under pressure to complete their college work as quickly as possible, and to get out to the more serious business of earning a living. They are willing to co-operate in any worthwhile student project, but they have precious

 "Your student officers are pledged to maintain a representative student government. We shall not fail our pledge. Therefore, we urge all members of the student body to put aside party prejudices and unite behind the new student officers in their effort to give to Mercer student government at its best."
