Star Guard Joins 31-Man Squad For Workouts at Baptist School

Mercer University's basketball hopes for the coming season have been boosted by the return of Bob Schuler, star guard of last year's Bear quintet.

Schuler was not expected to play this year because he was working.

With Schuler back the Mercer squad has four of last year's starters, including Center Hugh Snow, Forward Glenn Wilkes, and Guard Bill (Shotgun) Sutton. The only member missing from the starting five is Forward Tom Dykes, who is no longer attending Mercer.

Schuler joined a squad of 31 basketball hopefuls who have been working three times a week since Oct. 1 in preparation for a tough 21-game schedule.

Coach Jim Cowan has been sending his charges through two-hour drills on fundamentals for the last two weeks to work out the summer kinks and to give him a chance to look over new players.

Two big freshman have shown a great deal of promise. They are Lamar Clements, who played for Columbus High last year, and David Barnett. Clements stands six feet three inches tall and Barnett towers up to six feet four inches.

The Mercer B team will not travel this year, but will play a 10-game schedule making double-headers out of all the varsity home games.

Four games have been lined up for the Bees so far and the other six will be scheduled before Nov. 8, when the varsity meets Howard College here.

Games scheduled for the B team to date are as follows: Jan. 30, Middle Georgia College; Feb. 17, Georgia Military College; Jan. 9, Abraham Baldwin, and Feb. 23, Brewton-Parker.
