REGISTRAR'S SURVEY SHOWS TOP ENROLLMENT FROM BIBB

In a recent release of figures made available by the Registrar's office to other colleges of the state, there is an account of the distribution of residences of Mercer students who were enrolled during the fall quarter.

Registrar Frank Clark's records show that Bibb county and Macon sent 491 students to Mercer; Fulton county and Atlanta, 49; Houston county and Perry, 28; Thomas county and Thomasville, 22.

Twenty students came from each of Floyd county and Rome, Laurens county and Dublin, and Muscogee county and Columbus. Twelve enrollments indicate residence in Colquitt county and Moultrie, Troup county and LaGrange, and Washington county and Sandersville.

Fall quarter figures also showed 156 registrations from outside the state, and three from beyond the nation's border.

The above and other information was compiled by Clark for statistical purposes and is made available on request to any college in Georgia. The survey shows cumulative hours and honor points of each transfer student, as well as comparative ranking with transfer students from other colleges. Seventeen schools have already replied to the notices, all requesting use of the survey.
