SPORTS RESUME. The past two weeks have been hectic ones for the Mercer student and even more hectic ones for the Mercer athlete. Since the Cluster's last issue, the four athletic teams have fought with varying degrees of success a good many contests—so many, in fact, that it would be impossible for this department to do them all justice. To help remedy the situation, this reporter has drawn up a resume of the sports highlights over this period.

Freshman hurler Arthur Allen relieved D. T. Carowan in the second inning of the Bear's initial game against Stetson and pitched Mercer to a 14 to 9 victory, its first and only one this year.

First Baseman Charlie Harris blasted a single, a double, and a triple to pace the Bear attack that racked up 14 runs against Stetson.

The leading stars against Stetson in the two games were third baseman Charlie Hopkins and shortstop Jimmy Stewart. Hopkins was sensational in both games as he turned in one fielding gem after another.

In the second Stetson contest, hurler Walker Whittle was shelled from the mound by the Hatter sluggers but then took over the left field spot and proceeded to rap out three hits.

In the Mercer golf team's 152 to 51/2 loss to Emory University, Sam Glasman, Jr. was the only man to break even. He divided three points with Bob Tutwiler.

The Mercer infield made two double plays against Newberry and one against Florida State. Curiously enough, hurler Arthur Allen participated in all three.

Southpaw first baseman Charlie Harris relieved Jack Smith on the mound against Stetson in the second game and put the skids on their red-hot assault which had racked up 12 runs. In a similar relief role against Florida State, however, he was touched for the two winning runs.

Pole Vaulter Jim Mount, high jumper "Dopey" Reynolds, and javelin thrower Lamar Davenport are undefeated in two track meets this season.

DISA AND DATA—Third baseman, Paul Smith, is threatening to crash his way into Coach Claude Smith's starting lineup. The North Carolina boy was a big factor in the Mercer rally against Florida State as he came through in the clutch with a desperately needed single. He also helped tighten up a porous Mercer infield whose errors were largely responsible for the flood of runs in the early innings.

They are still talking about Mayes Dobbins' performance against Florida State. The Bear second sacker slapped out three hits in four times at bat including a homer that literally took to the woods and then took over shortstop for the slumping Jimmy Stewart and played errorless ball.

And as if that wasn't enough, Dobbins rapped out three more hits against Fort Valley of the Mid-State League while playing with the Seals Brothers team. What a man!

MERCER'S GOLF TEAM SCORES VICTORY OVER FLORIDA STATE

The Mercer golf squad scored its second victory of the season against Florida State in a five-man team affair by an overwhelming 19 1/2 to 1 1/2 count in a match over the Bowden Municipal course Thursday afternoon.

Jack Morgan led the Mercer shotmakers, who had previously defeated State in Tallahassee, with a one over par 73 which was good enough to win 2 1/2 points from Florida's number one man, Sony

Tinney whose 74 was high for the visitors. Mercer's number two man, John Williford, defeated State's Eddie Andrews 3-0 and combined with Morgan in the foursome to take three more points from Tinney and Andrews. In the second foursome, the combination of Sam Glasman, Jr. and Jerry Kunes blanked Florida State's Hank Mercer and Walter Wells to take all nine points. Jack Gillon rallied on the back nine to defeat State's Ralph Cowart 2-1.

SAE Frat Captures Track Championship Lambda Chi Holds

The SAE fraternity threw, jumped, and ran themselves into the annual spring intra-mural track championship. The 34 points compiled by the SAE athletes were more than enough to best the efforts of the other fraternity and non-fraternity teams who followed in this order: Phi Delta Theta second with 30 points, Sigma Nu third with 28 points, Kappa Sigma fourth with 25 points, Kappa Alpha fifth with 7 points, and non-Frat sixth with 5 points.

The SAE lads captured five first places in their march to victory while the Phi Deltas took three. The meet was highlighted by the breaking of three intra-mural records, the shot put by Bradford King of SAE (41 feet, 9 inches), the discus by Jack Culpepper of Phi Delta Theta (112 feet), and a tie for first place and a new record in the pole vault by Jim Mount of Phi Delta Theta and Ray Brewster of Kappa Alpha (10 feet, 6 inches).

The high scorers of the meet were Rolland of SAE with first places in the high jump and broad jump and Davis of Kappa Sigma with firsts in the 100 and 220 yard dashes.

Bears Lose Ten-Inning Struggle To FSU As Mayes Dobbins Hits Round-Tripper

The Mercer Bears came within a hair of scoring their second victory of the season Thursday afternoon against Florida State, but ninth and tenth inning rallies gave the visitors a 14 to 12 victory.

The Mercer sluggers shelled two State hurlers from the mound, accumulated eleven hits including one homer, and amassed ten of their runs in three big innings.

Florida State's rampant attack was paced by their centerfielder, Brown, who collected four safeties in five trips to the plate. The visiting nine hammered thirteen hits off Mercer's Dilmas Barnett, Arthur Allen, and Charlie Harris which, coupled with four critical Mercer errors, gave them their margin of victory.

Dobbins' Home Run

Mayes Dobbins and Mac Marchman led the Mercerian offense with three hits each. Dobbins hit Mercer's first home run of the season in the sixth inning with none on. The hard hit ball carried to the edge of the centerfield green and bounded over the bank.

State scored first, tallying four runs off Barnett in the first three innings. The lanky right-hander was relieved by Arthur Allen. A costly infield error cost the Bears two more runs in the fourth and Florida led 6 to 0.

In the bottom of the fourth, the Bears finally adjusted their sights to the fancy twirling of Florida's Knight and raked him for three hits and four runs. Stewart walk-

ed, Marchman singled, Martin walked, and Harris blasted a double to right field to score two runs. A fly by Hopkins and a single by Rainey scored Martin and Harris with the other two runs.

A dropped infield fly and two singles resulted in two more State runs in the top of the fifth, and the visitors led 8 to 4.

Bear Rally

The Bears came roaring back in their half of the fifth to blast Knight from the mound and rake his replacement, Bassett, with equal liberty. Third baseman, Paul Smith, batting for Stewart, spearheaded the assault with a sharp single to centerfield. Mac Marchman followed suit with another single, and Martin walked to load the bases. A fly to center by Harris and a bobbled grounded off the bat of L. E. Smith, who had replaced Whittle in left field, brought in three runs.

State and Mercer scored one run each in the sixth to make the count 9 to 8.

The Bears exploded again in the bottom of the eighth frame for four more runs. Hopkins singled, Rainey sacrificed, Allen and Dobbins walked. A fly by Paul Smith scored Hopkins, and a double by Marchman brought in two more runs. Marchman then came home on a wild pitch.

State knotted the count in the ninth with three runs and then tallied two more off Charlie Harris in the tenth to clinch the game.

CRIMSON TIDE TRACKMEN RUN RAMPANT OVER BEARS

The Mercer University track squad was handed a 102 1/2 to 24 1/2 lambasting by the University of Alabama's Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa, Saturday afternoon.

Coach Jim Cowan's outclassed undermen were able to capture only one first place, the 220 yard low hurdles which Ed Holmes took in 27.3 seconds.
