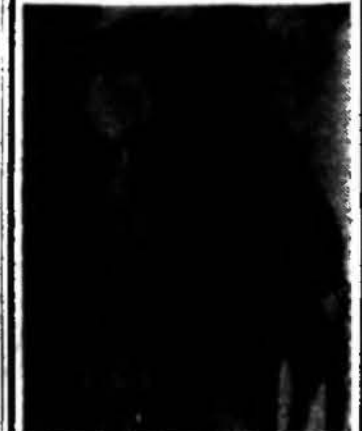
"BUZ" ALDERMAN is always an eye catcher in her green double-breasted suit. The coat has a belted back, and the skirt is very straight.
