## Bulldogs Defeat Bears 60 to 58

The mighty Georgia Bulldogs overcame the powerful Mercer Bears in the last ten seconds Tuesday night to win 60-58 in one of the most sensational games ever to be played in Porter gymnasium.

Bulldog center Bob Schloss tipped in guard Kermit Hall's missed free throw to give the Bulldogs a two-point marginal triumph.

The lead changed hands several times in the opening minutes of the game but after nine minutes of play the Bear's Glenn Cassell flipped in a long set shot to put the Bears in the lead which they kept until the last few seconds of the game.

Throughout the first half Mercer's fast break was getting behind the Bulldogs consistently with center Lamar Clements pacing the Bear's scoring.

Mercer was ahead at halftime, 40-32.

Bulldog Coach Jim Whatley used a two-platoon system against the Bears.

The Bears, however, were in better shape than ever and outscrapped the Georgia quintet throughout most of the game.

Aggressive Bobby Wilder outplayed the great Joe Jordan, both offensively and defensively, scoring 14 points to Jordan's eight.

He was referring back to '47 when Georgia came from behind to win 55-53 in the closing seconds of the game.

Tuesday night the gymnasium was packed above its capacity with around 2000 spectators witnessing this thrilling contest.

Many people expected the Bulldogs to crush the Bears, considering Georgia's victories over Tulane and Georgia Tech and Mercer's poor showing in the previous game.

The gymnasium was roaring when Coach Cowan's spectacular Bears pulled ahead of the powerful Bulldogs after the opening minutes of the Bears left for the Land of Sunshine yesterday to engage

The spectators were tense and excited throughout the entire game, and the yells never ceased during the playing time.

### Bears Travel to Florida

The Bears will head for the Land of Sunshine Friday as they engage in two off-games.

Tonight they will meet the Rollins College five, of Winter Park, Fla., who are expected to possess a strong team this season.

Saturday night they will compete with the Florida Southern squad of Tallahassee, from whom the Bears suffered a humiliating 66-41 defeat here at Porter Gymnasium.

They returned home Sunday and will meet Mississippi College here Feb. 5.

## Georgia Teachers College Downs Mercer Bears 69-44 in Collegeboro

The power-packed Georgia Teachers College banged out a 69-44 victory over the Mercer Bears before an overflowing partisan crowd at the Teachers gym, Collegeboro, Saturday night.

It marked the 13th triumph for the Teachers quintet in 14 games, while being the fourth consecutive loss for the Bears.

In the first few minutes of the game, the two teams were evenly matched with the score being 14-14 after 11 minutes of play.

However, led by Parsons and Perkins the Teachers began to rack up a comfortable lead and at half-time the score was 35-17 in their favor.

After half-time the Teachers quintet, featuring an excellent passing attack, continued their fast scoring and the Bears never threatened.

Lamar Clements was the offensive man for the Bears, scoring 13

points.

Bob Reeder and Bill Harris deserve much praise for their fine backboard control.

Mercer was especially weak in the free throw department, ringing 6 out of 26 attempts.

Frank Clements and Parsons led the Teachers College five with 15 and 14 points respectively.

Glenn Cassell exhibited great defensive play in holding the Teachers' 6'4" center Tom Perkins, who formerly averaged over 20 points per game, to only three field goals while guarding him.
