Mercer Student Found Guilty by Law School's Moot Court Jury

A Mercer student was convicted of indecent dress by a jury at Moot Court Tuesday night in the Law Building. The jury took only twenty minutes to render the verdict of guilty based mostly on the testimony of an 8 year old girl. Judge Cecil Baldwin presiding over the trial.

Shirly Snowflake, the 8 year old witness, testified that the student had been indecently clad in her presence. She identified the student without doubt.

The prosecuting attorneys, George Napier and Ray Tucker, based their case on this and the eye-witness account of Shirley's Nurse and the nurse's boy friend, a janitor at Mercer. These two said they saw the defendant at 8:00 P.M. on the night of December 19, 1951 leaving the park. They said they saw him at a distance of about 150 feet.
