selves safe before coming out of hiding. Car license numbers were taken from the students vehicles, but it was not known immediately whether they would take any action.

Girls at Rivoli urged the aggression. They started chanting, "We want men, we want men."

University officials quelled the riot at Porter by stating that any person who entered the building would be suspended from school immediately.

Students took refuge behind whatever cover they could when flashbulbs started popping. Newspaper men from uptown took numerous photos of the raiders.
