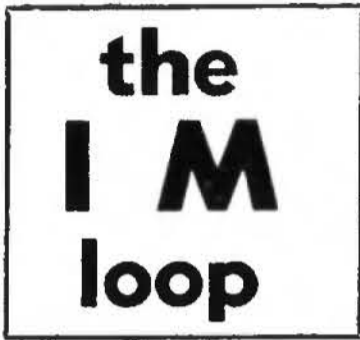

MSgt. Malambri left the Mercer unit on March 15 to become the Assistant Band Commander of the 3rd Army Band.

MSgt. Malambri came to Mercer from Fort Bragg, N. C., to take command of the band in the fall of 1954. Under his direction the band has added five Mercer girls as majorettes.

SFC Molohon, who was born in Divernon, Ill., says he is a converted Yankee, and calls Jesup, Ga., his home. He is married to a south Georgia girl from Screven, which is just a few miles from Jesup, and they have one daughter.

Sgt. Molohon has had twelve years of service in the Army. Overseas he has served in England, France, Germany, Japan, and Korea. He was stationed at Fort Campbell, Penn., before coming to Mercer.

ChiO's Win First Softball Game

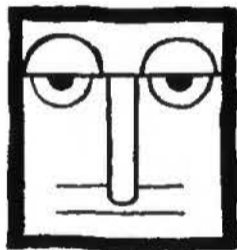
The women's intramural softball tournament got underway April 8 as Chi Omega beat ADPI.

Helen Faulkner was winning pitcher.

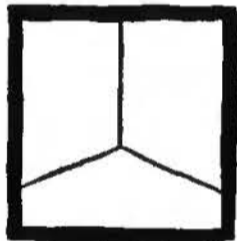
FOUR INITIATED BY KAPPA SIGMA

Four new brothers were initiated into Kappa sigma Wednesday night April 4.

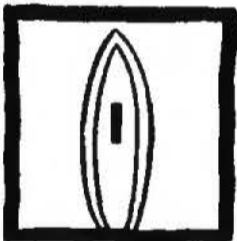
The new brothers are Maynard Chambers, Jesse Causey, Bobby Jones and Will Rogers.



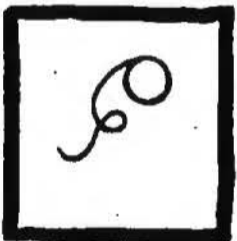

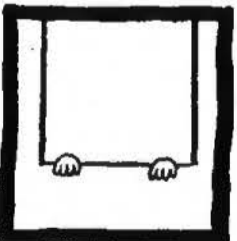

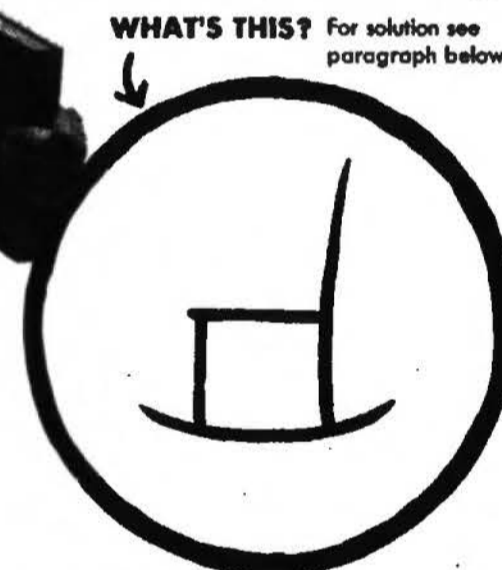
