

# Mercer Tops a Hundred To Flood Tars, 104-78

Mercer University's Bears downed the Rollins College Tars last Monday night by a score of 104-78. It was the second game of the season that the Bears had won by a score over the century mark.

The Mercer squad was in fine form as they rolled over the Rollins team's coached by former Mercer head coach, Dan Nyimick. Nyimick was the head coach at Mercer when the current Mercer head, Bobby Wilder, was a player.

Mercer's first string forward, Bobby Graham, was the high scorer of the evening with a total of 32 points. Graham could not seem to miss as he set the record for individual scoring on the Bear squad this season. Woody Richardson pushed in a total of 22 points and guard Mel Kinslow accounted for 16 using his now famous "Kinslow Kick". Sub John McGriff was fourth on the Mercer team with 13 points for the evening.

Rollins jumped ahead in the opening seconds of the game with a 8-0 lead and the Bears called time out. The Bears came back to tie the score and then proceeded to gain a 22-14 lead midway in the first half. The half saw Mercer leading by a score of 53 to 35.

The second half saw the Bears push their lead to a substantial 94-68 and Mercer head coach Wilder put the second team in for the remainder of the game. Sub Ray Banks had the honor of sinking the basket that gave Mercer the score of 100 to 68.

The Bears had a percentage of .453 to make this one of their best games of the season. Rollins followed with a game percentage of .389.

Lee Martindale lead the Rollins team in points with a total of 18 and guard Boyd Coffie was second on the Tar squad with 16. Martindale had twelve consecutive free throws to go with his three field goals.

In the rebound department, Mercer lead with 48 while the tall Rollins team got only 45. Richardson was high man on the Mercer side with 10 while center Craft and guard Bolton each had eight. Dick Besemer lead Rollins in rebounds with 15.

Rollins hit 26 of 37 free throws and Mercer hit an excellent 30 out of 35.

The Mercer "B" team won the preliminary game on a free throw made by Silas Read after the final whistle had blown.

Mercer's Harris was high man with 21 and Gene Powell was next with 10. Armstrong's high man was Reed Short who had a total of 21 and Burns was second with 11. This was the second game that the Mercer "B" team has won by a foul shot after the final whistle. They beat Georgia Military College on Feb. 1 in this same manner.

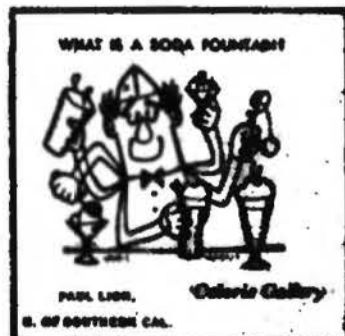
