Mercer Track Team Tries For Comeback This Year

There is no Mercer University track team. There was one last year until the time that the University of Tennessee was coming down to Mercer for a track meet—and it had to be cancelled because there were only five men in the student body to run in the meet.

Just before this final blow, Mercer had competed in a three-way track meet at Davidson—with only six men making the trip. We had meets scheduled with strong schools last year. It would be foolhardy for a student body to think that their track team can put forth the physical effort to win event after event against a strong school with only five men on the team if each one of them is not an Olympic Derathlon champion.

The remainder of the meets in the season were cancelled. The students who had stayed out for track, because they thought that out of the student body would come enough men to make the track team a success, were told that there would be no more track team at all that year.

If at least 35 men will go out and stay out for track, we can have a team. If it is evident that the men will persevere, there will be cross country meets in the fall as the beginning of next year's track program. Mr. Vance, chairman of the Department of Health and Physical Education, has made the statement that if 35 students will work under Coach Wilder's direction it will mean the beginning of Mercer track and cross country teams once more.

Mercer has the potential for a good track team. The results of the intramural meet last spring showed that to be true, even though most of those who competed in that meet performed their events without having gotten into condition. If the men here who ran last year for the teams of their fraternities or other organizations will run their races and perform their field events for their school this year, we may have a very good

team. If all those men who lamented the fact that it was a shame that the track team had to be cut out last year will come to Porter Stadium to work out this year to make a team, Mercer will have probably more students than any other college in the South to make a track team.

Mercer will be a stronger school when the men here who have the physical ability and the spirit to make a track team do just that. If 35 or more will forge together a team under the direction of Coach Wilder—and if they have the real support of the student body's school spirit—the chances are that Mercer University will win one or more track meets this year.

ATO Tops Eagles In Early Play
