

Round-up IM Basketball

Here is a round-up of intramural basketball games played since the last issue of the Cluster:

The Crewcuts won by forfeit over the Lawyers although the Lawyers had a higher score 30-25. The Legal Eagles were ahead 12-10 at halftime behind the shooting of Martin and went on to take the contest by a slim margin. High man for the Crewcuts was Jerry Holland with 9 followed by Bill Crane with 8.

Kappa Sigma stretched its winning streak to 3 by stopping the Big L's of Lambda Chi in a low scoring contest 23-10. Charles Deal led the Sigs in scoring with 8 for the evening. Deal paced the Crescents to a 15-4 advantage at halftime and the KayCees coasted home in the second as the Big L comeback stopped short of the mark.
