# Two Bears on Paper's Team

Two members of Mercer's 1957-58 basketball team gained positions on the Atlanta Constitution's 7th annual Georgia College all-star squad.

Junior Norman Carter was selected to one of the forward positions on the first team and senior Woody Richardson was named to the second squad.

Carter, who hails from Talbotton, Georgia, is a transfer this year from Clemson College. He stands 6-3 and averaged nearly 20 points a game to lead the Bears in scoring. Carter was selected not only for his shooting skill but also for his rebounding ability.

Richardson, a native of Monroe, Georgia, measures in at 6-2 and posted the Bears second highest shooting average for the '57-58 campaign. The only starter back from last year, Richardson captained the Bruins this past season.

Georgia Tech placed two of its stand-outs, Dave Denton and Terry Randall on the All-Star first team, the University of Georgia was represented by Henry Cabiniss.

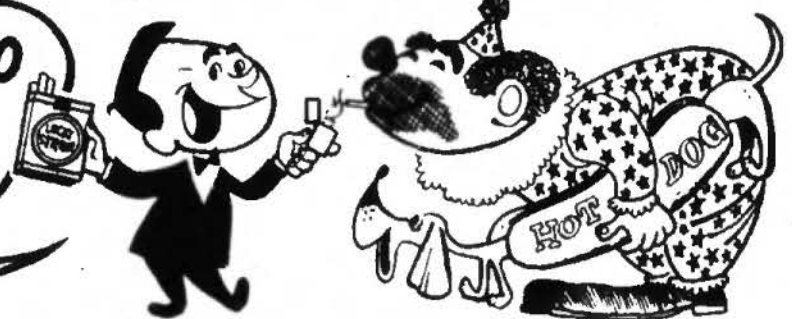

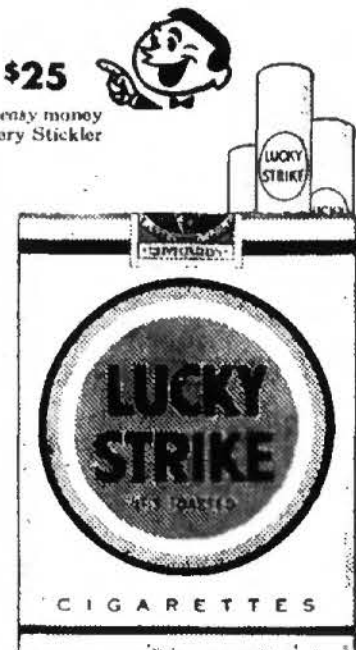
