**Heads of Mercer University Liter-
 ary Departments Added
 to Faculty**

Bessie Tift college this year makes application for admission to the Southern Association of Colleges, and according to President Chamber and his thirty instructors, the institution will be a first class woman's college in every particular. The college has just opened with an increased enrollment of 50 per cent over that of the previous year.

The preparatory department has now been entirely eliminated so that every student matriculating must have the required fifteen Carnegie units. Arrangements have been made with Mercer University to have the heads of four of the departments of Mercer University to supervise and instruct in the literary departments of Bessie Tift. Each of the new heads of departments are regular Ph. D's and in addition to supervising the department will teach six scheduled hours.

Dr. Percy Scott Flippin, dean of the Graduate School of Mercer University, will be in charge of the History Department at Bessie Tift. Dr. J. Clay Walker, of the Mercer University Modern Language Department, is to be in charge of a similar department

at Bessie Tift. Dr. F. J. Holder, mathematics instructor at Mercer University, will look after the same department at Bessie Tift, and Dr. Herman Kurtz will instruct in the scientific department. George M. Sparks will supervise the Bessie Tift School of Journalism. Dr. C. T. Goode of the Department of English at Mercer University, will teach English at Bessie Tift College.

The exceptional schedules from Macon to Forsyth and the splendid highway combine to greatly simplify the question of transportation for the instructors making the trip. It is only a ride of forty-five minutes each way and due to a change of time going from Macon to Forsyth the professors reach Forsyth fifteen minutes sooner than they begin at Macon.

To the 3,000 volumes in the Bessie Tift College library enough books have been added during the Summer to total 11,000 volumes. A new gas meter has been added in the laboratory to the present equipment of compressed air, electricity, hot water, X-ray and motion picture machine. Several new pianos have been added during September.

Bessie Tift College is the woman's college of the Mercer University System of Schools and Colleges.

There will be a new heating system installed in the library, which add much to the comfort of those at work there in the winter time. Miss Boone will at all times keep the library as attractive as possible.
