

EIGHTY-SEVEN ARE ON FACULTY FOR 1,000 STUDENTS IN FIFTEEN DEPARTMENTS AT MERCER

Instructors Are Assembled From
All Over World

Many Distinguished Men Numbered
Among Scholarly Group

Many members have been added to the Mercer University faculty, bringing the total now up to nearly a hundred, with a view of properly caring for the more than 1,000 students expected to matriculate during the coming year. The total enrollment in the fifteen departments of the university last year was 866.

Dr. Rufus W. Weaver, in his effort to furnish one of the best equipped faculties in the South, has gathered the best trained men from all over the world. Besides such notables as Chief Justice William H. Fish, dean of the Law School, and Dr. A. H. Newman, celebrated church historian, the following faculty members were formerly presidents of colleges—Dr. A. P. Montague, Furman University; Howard College, Columbia College, and dean of George Washington University; Dr. Charles Bray Williams, Howard College; Dr. W. E. Farrar, Bethel College, and Prof. John F. Carter, Clark Memorial College.

Big Law School.

The Mercer University Law School, for many years one of the prominent schools because of its producing so many judges, congressmen and senators have now met all the requirements of the Association of American Law Schools and seeks membership this fall. In addition to its regular faculty of Middle Georgia jurists in the law school other members added to the faculty recently are Dr. John Howard Moore, A. B., J. D., Yale; Dr. Rufus C. Harris, A. B., L. L. B., J. D., Yale; Judge J. N. Tidley and Prof. T. M. Smith, Mercer University, and C. Baxter Jones, Yale.

The athletic department of the university will be under the direction of Coach Stanley Robinson, Colgate graduate and former head coach of the University of Vermont, Mississippi A. and M., and Mississippi College. His assistants will be "Pink" Gillam, formerly his assistant at other institutions, and E. Parker Mosely, for many years one of the outstanding preparatory school coaches of Georgia.

The fall term opens September 26th with the following new faculty members: C. Baxter Jones, Yale; Herman F. Kurtz, Clark University; J. H. Moore, Chicago; Burt Parker Richardson, University of Leipzig; Stanley L. Robinson, Colgate; Welcome T. Smalley, Columbia; Judges James N. Talley, University of Georgia; Lowell Taylor Wallace, William-Jewell College; Charles S. Woodall, Harvard; Arthur John Dunlap, Boston University; Lucius M. Polhill, Louisville Seminary; Rufus C. Harris, Yale; John F. Carter, Clark Memorial; Lorne Barclay, Yale; F. M. Hunter, Columbia; Nelson Shipp, Mercer; M. Rolston, Wesleyan; R. O. Wyland, Harvard.

Last year the Graduate School, of which Dr. P. H. Flippin is dean, enrolled about twenty and according to information reaching the Registrar's office many more are expected to

The university proper now includes: Graduate School, College of Arts and Sciences, School of Law, School of Theology, School of Journalism, School of Education, School of Commerce, Pre-Engineering, Pre-Medical, Pre-Legal, Night School of Commerce, Summer School, Boy Scout Executives of Southeast, Woman's Institute for Training in Civic Leadership.

Five years ago Mercer had about twelve on faculty for 250 students in two departments. This year the faculty totals 87 for 1,000 students in fifteen departments.
