## Dr. King Addressed Jr. College Meeting

Dr. Spencer B. King, head of the History Department at Mercer addressed the annual meeting of the Georgia Association of Junior Colleges Friday evening, October 13. The group met on the campus of Georgia Southwestern College in Americus.

Dr. King's speech, "Pragmatism is Not Enough", emphasized "the idea of aesthetic beauty, artistic creation, love of learning for learning sake."

He stated that, "Science, and its handmaid, pragmatism, have made us a healthy, happy people able through educational processes to work together in a democratic society." He continued "Nevertheless, the technological world is only a part of my universe."

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
