## Duke Uni. Teacher Program

Any qualified Mercer senior who plans to teach junior or senior high school may now apply to Duke University for their special 15 month training program. The program provides for a full year's salary and experience as a teacher, tuition scholarships, a master's degree and certification for teaching.

The Cooperative Program in Teacher Education is a Ford Foundation subsidized training period to provide for superior college graduates who did not prepare professionally for teacher certification as undergraduates. It includes professional courses, advanced study in the candidates special field and care-

fully supervised teaching experience.

Applications will be received from candidates who wish to teach English, foreign languages, mathematics, science or social studies.

The program begins with the first term of Duke Summer Sessions in early June.

Interested students should apply directly to the Dean of the Graduate School of Arts and Science, Duke University, Durham, North Carolina, for admission to the Cooperative MAT Program. ## Nat'l Teacher Examinations

The National Teacher Examinations, prepared and administered annually by Educational Testing Service, will be given at more than 200 testing centers throughout the United States on Saturday, February 10, 1962.

At the one-day testing session a candidate may take the Common Examinations, which include tests in Professional Information, General Culture, English Expression, and Non Verbal Reasoning; and one or two of thirteen Optional Examinations designed to demonstrate mastery of subject matter to be taught. The college which a candidate is attending, or the school system in which he is seeking employment, will advise him whether he should take the National Teacher Examinations and which of the Optional Examinations to select.

A Bulletin of Information describing registration procedures may be obtained from college officials, school superintendents, or directly from the National Teacher Examinations, Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey. Completed applications, accompanied by proper examination fees, will be accepted by the ETS office during November and December, and early in January so long as they are received before January 12, 1962.
