

## Open House At Mercer Library

The library staff and student assistants will sponsor a guided tour of the Mercer Library's Museum next Thursday between 3 and 5, announced Mr. Charles H. Stone, head librarian.

The museum contains a large number of famous antiques such as Jesse Mercer's pulpit, chair, desk, and family Bible. Also, pictures of the first graduating class (1811) will be on display as will the M.A. Diploma of Richard Malcom Johnson, one of the three members in that class.

Southerners should be interested in a personal letter from Robert F. Lee to Mercer, accepting an honorary degree, the only such degree he ever accepted.

Also found in the museum are histories of the South, the Baptists, Georgia, and Mercer. Other publications include two books dating back to the fifteenth century, Mercer's publications going back to the 1870's, and the most complete file of the Christian Index, edited by Jesse Mercer, in existence.
