Present it at any Banking House and it will be cashed. Your Bro Nat knows, but he might be absent, and consequently I am particular.

I received intelligence from you to-day by telegraph. Mr. [Sarille] inquired of Col. Logan, who stated that you left for Atlanta tomorrow 15th and I'll write this letter to meet you there, I shall come for you Sunday, and if you can come I shall bring you home. Bless your darling heart, I'm most crazy to see you once more. I had the carpet put down today and will finish moving tomorrow I believe we'll have a very pleasant house at Mr. Cary's.

Now, darling wifey, kiss me good bye and get ready to come home with old husband. Kiss little baby for papa.
